#### Chief Scout's Annual report for 2021

After coming out of a difficult 2020, the beginning of 2021 seemed to give us some hope of things improving, but this was not to be, since numbers of Covid-19 cases started to rise again, and most scouting activities were relegated to an online platform again. Despite these drawbacks, I am pleased to state that 2021 was a very productive year, especially for the National Scout Council which continued to meet regularly at least once a month to discuss matters and take important decisions via online meetings. There were also quite a few sub-committee meetings held, where issues were being tackled by smaller groups and this helped speed up the work of the Council. Some of the highlights involved changing the financial procedures within the Association and the setting up of an effective new Finance Audit & Risk (FAR) committee as well as matters pertaining to the proper set-up and recognition of the Scout Fellowship, amongst others.

Since we could not physically have the Annual Parade in Valletta due to Covid-19 restrictions, a Mass was held at the Archbishop's Seminary in Rabat in April for representatives of the various Scout and Girl Guide groups. Holy Mass was celebrated by HG The Archbishop, whilst HE The President of Malta (and patron of The Scout Association) and Mrs Vella graced us with their presence. November saw the Wood badge and Awards ceremony also at the Archbishop's Seminary, and this event brought many leaders together again before the end of the year.

2021 seems to be the year we are slowly getting out of the pandemic and where hopefully scouting activities will resume to a "new normality." I auger that it will be a better year for all of us.

#### **Training Department Annual Report 2021**

2021 was a year of evolvement for the training department. Due to the unprecedented effects of the coronavirus pandemic, till mid-year, all training was being held online. New guidelines were established so that leaders following such courses could continue with their joint activities to be able to complete their courses. When things started to get better, and we were approaching normality some courses like the Basic Course was held in person. Therefore, the first evolvement was the start to get back to physical activities after two years of online meetings.

This was also the time when Marlon Psaila decided not to put his name in the hat for the role of Training Commissioner for a further term of 5 years. Marlon was in charge for both the Adult Resources and the Youth Programme and Development.

This brought about another evolvement, this time in the way the Training Department should operate. To ensure that the necessary attention is being given to both aspects of the Training function, two roles ensued. One commissioner role dedicated for the Adult Resources and another for the Youth Programme and Development. Vanessa Mangion a former team member of the Training Department assumed the role as Commissioner for Adult Resources and Daniel Cassar, who at the time was Commissioner for the Scouts Programme, now assumed the role of Commissioner for Youth Programme and Development.

The Training Awards Ceremony held in November was the last activity that encompassed all these changes and to recognize the efforts of those who finished part or all of their woodbadge training. Following this eventful year, the training team is now looking forward to continue to implement changes needed to ensure that we deliver quality training for both our current and future leaders as well as quality programmes for our youths.

### International Department

#### **Covid-19 Restrictions**

Due to the pandemic, we had no international exchanges and all planned gatherings/camps where either cancelled or transferred online.

#### Scout.org updating

The scout.org website has been updated with this years' final accounts and the minutes of the AGM. A copy of the census was published accordingly. The yearly membership fee paid on time

#### **World Scout Conference**

The 42nd world Scout conference and the 14<sup>th</sup> World Scout Youth forum were held virtually in Augusta and brought together a total of more than 3,000 leaders from 170 National Scout Organizations and global partners to shape the future of the world's leading educational youth Movement. Our association fully participated by voting for constitutional amendments and for the election of the new committee, appointing Andy Chapman as the new Chairperson.



#### **Global Youth Summit**

The 2021 edition of the Global youth summit happened online between the 21<sup>st</sup> and the 23<sup>rd</sup> of April. Our Association was represented by two youths after a selection process. A total of 152 countries and partners delivered 70 hours of incredible and impactful content. The WOSM was one of the Big 6 youth organizations working hard to create a better world.

#### Jota Joti 2021

Numerous groups participated in this year's edition of the JOTA JOTI organised by WOSM between the 15<sup>th</sup> and the 17<sup>th</sup> of October. This is the world's largest digital Scout event that takes place on the Internet and over the airwaves and connects millions of young people around the world for a full weekend of online activities that promote friendship and global citizenship. JOTA-JOTI enables young people and volunteers to participate in fun and engaging group activities over the Internet and amateur radio focused on developing 21st century skills through Scouting.

#### The Academy

This year's edition of the Academy was carried out virtually between the 30<sup>th</sup> of October and the 7<sup>th</sup> of November. The event was open to anyone holding a role at national level in a WAGGGS or WOSM. The staff members and volunteers, ranging from members of working groups up to Chief Commissioners come from all over the world. Our association fully participated in most of the events held throughout the week. The Academy is a unique Scout and Guide event designed to enable participants to get high quality training and networking opportunities around the core priorities of the European Regions of WAGGGS and WOSM.

#### EuroJam 2021 - Cancelled

The 2020 European Jamboree, which was scheduled to happen in Poland in 2020 and postponed for 2021 had to be cancelled due to the risks caused by covid-19. The international department made sure that the local participants who have registered to participate in this event get back most of the refunds paid as deposits.

Scout at Heart symbolises the fact that we remained active during the pandemic, despite the limitations to hold Scouting activities. In fact, Scout at Heart was a follow-up initiative on Scout at Home. This gesture was appreciated by all leaders within the association.

As our members are mostly senior citizens the holding of physical activities, in keeping with the Health Authorities' protocols and recommendations, was not possible.

Our only activity for the year was the organization of on-line Lenten talks in March by Reverend Anton Briffa. The Annual Christmas Get Together and our Annual General Meeting had to be cancelled at the last minute because of the rise in Covid cases as we felt it would not be prudent to put the health of our members at risk.

The Executive committee continued to hold its' meetings on line on a regular basis in order to deal with the on-going business of the Fellowship. The main focus during the year was the change of bankers from HSBC to APS due to the monthly charges being imposed by the former bank on the account held by the Fellowship.

The future organizational status of the Fellowship remained a major topic of the year and the Executive committee had a number of online meetings with The Chief Scout, Chief Commissioner and Honorary Secretary in an effort to reach an agreement on the way forward. The discussion at these meetings mainly centered around the Fellowship Units in the Scout Groups and the uniform to be worn by members of the Fellowship.

Currently the Malta Scout Fellowship has thirty-six (36) members having sadly lost two (2) of our members, Mr. Charles Johnson and Mr. Michael Brockdorff during the year. On a brighter note, Ms. Rose Laporto, one of our last two remaining founder members of the Fellowship, besides Mr. Vincent Cassar, celebrated her 100<sup>th</sup> birthday.
