

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
A Simple Friendship Bracelet

Show your friends that you care and that you want to show it to the whole world.

What you'll need:

- Bracelet template
- Bright Colours
- Scissors
- Decorations—sequins, glitter glue, etc.

- Enlarge and print the template on cardboard paper.
- Cut out the bracelet template.
- Colour it in.
- Put a small slit at each end so that the ends will slide through each other and the bracelet will not open up.






Candy Roses

What you'll need:

- Triangular Shaped Wrapped Chocolates
- Double-sided tape
- Cellophane
- Green florist tape
- Wooden Kebab Sticks
- Ribbon
- Scissors
- Wire cutters (to be handled by a Leader)

- Using a small square of the double-sided tape, stick the 2 chocolates together, bottom to bottom. It will help the Beavers handle the chocolates while wrapping.
- Take a piece of cellophane.
- Place the tip of one of the chocolates in the centre of the square, then wrap the cellophane around both chocolates, gathering the corners together around the tip of the other chocolate.
- Wrap the gathered corners together as tightly as you can.
 - Insert a wooden kebab stick into the gathered cellophane until it meets the tip of the chocolates. (Do not
 - push the wood into the chocolate!)
 - Wrap the edges of the cellophane together with the kebab stick tightly with the florist tape and keep going until all the kebab is covered in florist tape.
 - Make some more roses and put them in a small vase or bottle.
 - Decorate the bottle or vase with ribbons.





















Beaded Pencil Wraps What you'll need: Pencil Craft Wire Alphabet and Regular Beads Wire cutters (to be used by a

Long Nose Pliers (to be used by a Leader)

- Cut a piece of wire about 4- to 6-inches long. You can change this depending on the design you want to make.
- Use the long nose pliers and bend down the tip of one end of the wire.
- String beads onto the wire to spell out a name or another word.
- Once you have your beads all on the wire, clip off any extra wire leaving just enough to bend over the end so the beads stay in place.
- To use the wrap, all you do is wrap the wire into a tight spiral around the pencil.






Bottle Bracelets

What you'll need:

- Small 1/2 Ltr Plastic Bottle
- Craft Knife (to be used by a leader)
- Strips of Scarp Materials or Ribbon
- Items for decoration: sequins, fake jewels, buttons, foam stickers, glitter glue, etc.
- White Glue
- Paint Brush
- Apron
- Plastic Sheets

- Cover the work surface with plastic sheets so that it will be easier to clear up after the activity.
 - With the help of your BSL, cut bands out of the plastic bottle.
 - Brush White Glue on both sides of the bangle
 - Wind the strips of scrap materials or ribbon tightly around the band. Press tightly as you go along and add more glue if
 - needed.
















What you will need:

- 2 Packets of plain biscuits
- 1 Tin condensed milk
- 1 Packet chocolate hundreds and thousands
- 1 plastic mixing bowl

- Apron

- Paper cups

How to do it:

- Put the biscuits in a plastic bag and crush them with a rolling pin

- Add the chocolate chips.
- Roll the mixture into small balls.
- Dip the balls into the chocolate hundreds and thousands.
- Place each ball into a paper cup
- Display them

Scout Magnets

What you'll need:

- Clothespin
- Fleur De Lys Cut Out
- Magnet
- Paint
- Glue
- Decorations—Pom Poms, Stars, etc

How to make it:

- Paint the clothespin
- Hanging clothespins from a string will make it easier.
- Glue Fleur de Lys cut out to clothes pin and then glue the star on top of the fleur-de-lys.
- Glue the magnet onto the clothes pin.
- Decorate as desired.

Mosaic Frames

Do you like mosaic art? Unfortunately it can be expensive and not practical for young children.


What you will need:

- Old greeting cards, magazines, business cards
- White Glue
- Popsicle Sticks
- Round tip Scissors



- Start with 8 jumbo popsicle sticks, and glued them together with white glue.
- Let dry thoroughly.
- Cut several cards/magazines/etc with a scissors into same sized squares that are just a bit thinner than the width of the stick.
- Glue these onto the frame with white glue, leaving a small amount of space on either side.
- Fill your frame with a photo, drawing, or your favourite quote.
- To hang, apply a stick-on hanger on the back.





Sweets Holders

What you will need:

- · Cup cake holders
- Thick Patterned paper
- Flower template
- Glue
- Scissors—Round Tip
- Sweets



- Using the flower template, draw the flowers on the patterned paper and cut them out.
- Take each cup cake holder and glue them onto the centre of each flower
- · Let them dry well.
- Fill in the cup cake holder with your favourite sweets.







Matchbox Keepsake Boxes

Those tiny matchboxes may seem too small for anything other than, well, matches, but this colourful project proves otherwise. They can be used for small items of jewellery, sweets, and other keepsakes

What you'll need:

- Decorative paper
- Ruler
- Empty matchboxes
- Craft glue
- Thumbtack
- Wooden skewer
- Large-eyed needle
- Narrow ribbon
- Decorations

- Cut a piece of decorative paper to wrap around the box.
- Cut two more pieces to cover the ends of the drawer. Glue the paper to the box and let it dry completely.
- Remove the drawer and use the thumbtack to punch 2 holes, side by side, in one side of the box. Use the pointed end of the skewer to slightly enlarge the holes.
- Use the needle to thread the ribbon down through one hole and up through the other, then knot the ribbon against the outside of the box.
- Line the drawer with matching paper, then slide it back in place. Decorate the outside of the box with a shape cut from coordinating paper. Fill the box with tiny treasures.
